Reasons	West Oxfordshire District Council, in accordance with regulation 4(3)(b)(iv)(bb) of the Neighbourhood Planning (Referendums) Regulations 2012 confirmed in a statement (Chief Executive - dated 11 November 2019) that the District Council was satisfied that the draft Eynsham Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions required. This statement followed suitable modifications to the Plan made in response to modifications recommended in the external independent examination of the Neighbourhood Plan (Independent Examiner's Report – dated 23 July 2019).				
	The Neighbourhood Plan was cleared for referendum which was held on 30 January 2020. More than 50% of those who voted were in favour of the Plan being used to help decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area (see Declaration of Result of Poll – 30 January 2020). Paragraph 38A (4)(a) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 as amended requires that the District Council must make the neighbourhood Plan if more than half of those voting have voted in favour of the plan. The referendum held on 30 January 2020 met the requirements of the Localism				
	Act 2011. The referendum posed the question: "Do you want West Oxfordshire District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Eynsham to help decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?" The results of the referendum were:
